Recruiting: Past President, Bill Halpin has been appointed Division Organizer. Recruitment is first in this monthøs newsletter because without continuous and vibrant growth we might easily wither and pass into AOH history.

For example, the Father Munley Division (named for our division founder!) was a vibrant, contributing division in the Winchester area. In recent years division leaders neglected to mount a concerted recruitment effort. Over several years, the membership was depleted due to age related infirmities that made full participation difficult, job-related moves and disinterest borne in the lack of vibrancy. In October 2013, the remaining three men petitioned to have the division removed from active status, they properly emptied their treasury, and today they no longer exist.

We need to collectively shepherd the Meagher Division health and welfare with the õHibernian Zealö we pledged when we joined the AOH. Notes From the State Meeting: Important issues taken up at the Quarterly State Meeting on 25 Jan include:

VAAOH adopted the following resolution on Irish Immigration:

Whereas the Preamble in our AOH National Constitution, Item 7 states that a main purpose of our organization is: To encourage an equitable U.S. immigration law for Ireland, and to cooperate with groups for a fair American Immigration Policy, Whereas noting with satisfaction the current efforts of the National Immigration Chairman, Dan Dennehy, working to secure a legal path for Irelandsøundocumented and secure future flow for Irish immigrants,

Whereas the fact that Comprehensive Immigration Reform is now possible and Irish people will have a real opportunity from current legislation to create a new life for themselves in our great Nation and to continue to contribute to the important bonds between Ireland and the US,

- 1. Encourages all Virginia AOH Divisions to cooperate with other organizations at the grassroots level to support the cause of equitable immigration reform;
- 2. Urges members to comply with the goals of U.S. Catholic Bishops and their goals to pass a just and compassionate immigration reform;
- 3. Calls on appointed Immigration Chairmen and our Brother and Sister Hibernians and their families to help in attaining the successful passing of this reform;
- 4. Requests that each Division of the Virginia AOH appoint a Chairman of Immigration whose duties it will be to work with the Immigration Chair appointed by the National and State Boards.

<u>Irish Concert at Walter Reed Medical Center</u>: After visiting Army Sgt Eric Shields (son of an LOAH sister) who was wounded in Afghanistan, Brothers Keith Carney and Pat Troy decided to organize an AOH sponsored Irish Concert featuring Irish bands, Irish dance performances, etc. to be held at Walter Reed. The details are incomplete; however, they hope to schedule it in February.

National Convention: The AOH National Convention is scheduled for in St Louis, MO 30 July -3 August this year. Virginia has 29 convention delegates; it is imperative that VAAOH leaders ensure that all 29 votes are available at the convention. Our Tri-State organization (VA, MD, and DC) is the third largest bloc of voters behind NY and PA.

<u>State Chaplain's Comments</u>: Father Timothy Harris, TOR, commented on the March for Life and how important it is that we all odo the right thingo. Father Tim noted the oangero on the pro-choice side and admonished us not

present ourselves that way: we cannot be angry. We need to be courageous in Faith, Truth, and Strength, but always in love as Christ would.

<u>A Wee Bit o' Irish Folklore</u>:

The Ancient Order of Hibernians can trace its name to Irish Rebellion of 1641 and its motto "Friendship, Unity, and Christian Charity" to the Defenders of 1565 Ireland.

But did you know -- Thomas Radcliffe, Earl of Sussex, Lord-Lieutenant of Ireland in his 1565 edict against the Catholic religion, prohibited all monks and Catholic priests from either eating or sleeping in Dublin and ordered the

head of each family to attend Protestant services every Sunday, under the penalty of a fine.

In response, Irish prince Rory O'Moore of Leix (now County Laois) organized the Defenders, taking up the cause of religious freedom and the protection of the priesthood. Rory O'Moore's belonged to the Clan Rory of the Province of Ulster. Clan Rory were descended from the celebrated hero, Conall Cearnach, who was the chieftain of the Red Branch Knights at the beginning of the Christian era.

Under the Defenders protection, priests said Mass in the mountains, in the valleys and in the glens. After Prince O'Moore's death, the Defenders in their cause and under various chieftains grew as new branches sprang up. In due time these evolved into the "Terry-Alts" and the "Fenians". In addition to governmental oppression, these branches of the Defenders opposed a succession of Protestant organizations that evolved into present day "Orangemen". It is said that the spirit of O@Moore@s followers gave rise to the Ancient Order of Hibernians.
