## Trip for Two to Ireland Raffle

We kicked-off the first annual General T.F. Meagher Division `*Trip* for Two to Ireland\_ Raffle at the Blue & Gray Brewery s St. Patrick s Day Parade on March 14<sup>th</sup>. The winner gets two round-trip



air tickets from the east coast to Dublin; a rental car, and vouchers for six nights at B&Bs of their choice (travel agent provides a booklet with a list of B&Bs throughout the country). Each B&B welcomes visitors with tea and scones in the afternoon and serves a hardy Irish breakfast each morning. Travelers select a destination for the next evening and the B&B proprietor will call ahead to assure reservations.

Should the winner elect not to take the trip, we are offering an alternative prize of \$2500. We are selling only 1000 opportunities to win!

For the raffle to succeed, every Brother must be a salesman. ### **Saint Oliver Plunket**

The last Catholic martyr to die at Tyburn, he was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1975 St. Oliver Plunket (1629<sup>-</sup>1681) Born in County Meath, Oliver Plunket went to Rome to be educated by the Jesuits at the newly established Irish College. Ordained in 1654, he remained in Rome teaching theology until he was appointed archbishop of Armagh and primate of all Ireland in 1669. He established the Jesuits in Drogheda, where they conducted a school for boys and a theological college. He also sought to extend his ministry to the Gaelicspeaking Catholics of Scotland.



In 1678 an English conspirator, Titus Oates, implicated Plunket in what he claimed was a **Jesuit plot** to assassinate Charles II. As a result, Plunket was arrested and tried before a kangaroo court in London. Found guilty of treason, Oliver Plunket was hanged at Tyburn, mercifully dying before he could be drawn (disemboweled) and quartered. His remains are now enshrined in part at St. Peter's in Drogheda, Ireland, and in part at Downside Abbey in England.

General Thomas F. Meagher Thomas Francis Meagher (August 3, 1823 <sup>-</sup> July 1, 1867) was an Irish nationalist, a Union Army general during the American Civil War, and American politician. In his younger years he was an Irish revolutionary, fighting for Ireland's independence from British rule. He was known as "Meagher of the Sword" due to his fiery revolutionary speeches. During this time Meagher introduced the flag that is now the national Flag of Ireland. In 1848, Meagher was convicted of sedition by the United Kingdom, and sentenced to death. The sentence was later commuted to transportation to Van Diemen's Land (today the Australian state of Tasmania).

In 1852, he escaped to the United States and arrived in New York City. Once in the

United States, he studied law, pursued journalism, and traveled presenting lectures. At the commencement of the American Civil War, he joined the U.S. Army and rose to the rank of brigadier general, most notably forming and leading the Irish Brigade.

Following the Civil War, Meagher served as acting governor of the Montana Territory. In 1867, in unexplained circumstances, Meagher drowned in the Missouri River after falling from a steamboat.
