IMPORTANT ISSUE OF THE DAY

Our nation is facing internal <u>and</u> external threats. Internal threats include "progressive" politicians who suggest murder is a "woman's health" issue and our religious beliefs and freedoms must be forfeited if we are to be in step with "modern" America. As recently as August 27th, a Democrat presidential candidate equated pro-life advocates (by definition all Catholics) with "terrorist groups" adding (we) "refuse to live in the modern world... and we "espouse out-of-date and out-of-touch policies...for 21st century America." The Sunni jihadists were defeated at the Battle of Lepanto and the Pope declared **October 7**th to be the **Feast of Our Lady of Victory**.

Praying the Rosary is critically important as we work to defeat current threats from these patently evil elements. Prayers were answered in 1571 and can be answered again in 2015. At our meeting on September 15, the Division resolved to *Pray the Rosary on October 7, that Our Lady of Victory will deliver us from these evils*.

September in Irish History

September 2 1649 - *Siege of Drogheda* begins. The siege of Drogheda was perhaps the most ferocious sacking of a town in Irish history. Even today, viewed through the lens of Irish nationalist memory, it retains its capacity to inspire horror and anger. All Catholic priests found in Drogheda were clubbed to death by Cromwell's army.

September 3, 1972 - Mary Peters won the women's pentathlon in Munich and becomes the *first Irish woman to win an Olympic Gold medal*

September 5, 1771 - *Benjamin Franklin's visit to Ireland* begins. He reported "Ireland would be disposed to be friends of America."

September 7, 1695 - *Penal Laws are passed* which restrict the rights of Catholics to have an education, to bear arms, or to possess a horse worth more than five pounds; in **1921** Frank Duff founds the *Association of Our Lady of Mercy*, later to be known as the Legion of Mary **September 10, 1923** - The *Irish Free State* is admitted into the League of Nations **September 13, 1803** - Death of *Commodore John Barry*, Father of the U.S. Navy, a native of Ballystampson, Co. Wexford,

September 17, 1976 - The founders of the Peace Movement, Mairead Corrigan and Betty Williams, awarded the *Nobel Prize for Peace*

September 19, 1880 - Parnell delivers his famous speech at Ennis in which he *introduces the term for non-violent protest - boycotting*. Parnell asked his audience, 'What are you to do with a tenant who bids for a farm from which another has been evicted?' Several voices replied, 'shoot him!' Parnell answered: "I wish to point out a better way, a more Christian way which will give the lost man an opportunity of repenting. When a man takes a farm from which another has been evicted, you must shun him on the roadside, on the streets, in the shop and even in the place of worship by putting him in a "moral Coventry." You must show him your detestation of the crime he has committed".

Captain Charles *Boycott*, the British landowner, described his own situation in a letter to *The Times* "...people collect in crowds upon my farm and order off all my workmen. The shopkeepers have been warned to stop all supplies to my house. My farm is (now) public property, I can get no workmen to do anything, and my ruin is openly avowed as the object of the Land League unless I

throw up everything and leave the country" He was "boycotted" and that's where the term "boycott" originated.

September 20, 1803 - Robert Emmet, Irish patriot, is executed in Dublin. Emmet becomes a hero of Irish nationalists, largely on the basis of his stirring speech from the dock: "Let no man write my epitaph... When my country takes her place among the nations of the earth, then, and not till then let my epitaph be written"

September 25, 1697 - Catholic clergy are banished by Act of Parliament September 29, 1979 - Pope John Paul II arrives in Dublin for the first papal visit to Ireland
