There can be no peace between the two people until either Ireland is a desert or is free. It is war to the knife, and the knife to the hilt. There can be neither truce nor compromise."

SIXTH IN OUR SERIES OF IRISH PATRIOTS - EASTER 1916



Seán MacDiarmada

Born and raised in rural County Leitrim surrounded by signs of Irish history. There was an ancient sweat-house, Mass rocks from the penal times and the persecutions of the 17th and 18th centuries, and deserted abodes as an aftermath of *An Gorta Mor* in the 1840s. He was educated by the Irish Christian Brothers.

In 1908 he moved to Dublin, by which time he was already involved in several Irish separatist and cultural organisations that promoted the use of the Irish language and the Gaelic revival, including Sinn Féin, the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB), the Ancient Order of Hibernians and the Gaelic League. He was national organizer for Sinn Féin, and later manager of the radical newspaper <u>Irish Freedom</u>. Within the Irish Republican Brotherhood, he was a close colleague and friend of veteran republican Tom Clarke. He was promoted to the Supreme Council of the IRB and became an IRB national organizer. Shortly thereafter Mac Diarmada was stricken with polio and forced to walk with a cane.

In 1913 Mac Diarmada was one of the original members of the Irish Volunteers and worked to bring that organization under IRB control. In May 1915 Mac Diarmada gave a speech against Irishmen enlisting into the British Army. He was arrested for violating the `Defense of the Realm Act_Following his release from jail, he joined the secret Military Committee of the IRB, which was responsible for planning the rising.

Due to his disability, Mac Diarmada took little part in the fighting of Easter week, but was stationed at the headquarters in the General Post Office (GPO). Following the surrender, he nearly escaped execution by blending in with the large body of prisoners. However, he was betrayed by Daniel Hoey (Hoey was killed by Michael Collins's Squad).

Following a court-martial Mac Diarmada was executed by firing squad on 12 May at the age of 33. Before his execution, Mac Diarmada wrote:

"I feel happiness the like of which I have never experienced. I die that the Irish nation might live!"

HERITAGE COMMITTEE AT WORK

NEW BOOK! <u>The Immortal Irishman</u>, by Timothy Egan (\$17 at Amazon.com)

Exiled from Ireland, he won fame in the Civil War and died mysteriously on the Montana frontier. From best-selling author Timothy Egan comes the epic story of one of the most fascinating and colorful Irishman in nineteenthcentury America.

The Irish-American story, with all its twists and triumphs, is told through the improbable life of one man. A dashing young orator during the Great Famine of the 1840s, in which a million of his Irish countrymen died, Thomas Francis Meagher led a failed uprising against British rule, for which he was banished to Tasmania. He escaped and six months later was heralded in the streets of New York ' the hero, back from the dead, at the dawn of the great Irish immigration to America.

Meagher's rebirth in America included leading the Irish Brigade in many of the fiercest battles of the Civil War. Twice shot from his horse while leading charges, left for dead in the Virginia mud, Meagher's dream was that Irish-American troops, seasoned by war, would return to Ireland and liberate their homeland from British rule.

The hero's last chapter, as territorial governor of Montana, was a romantic quest for a true home in the far frontier. His death has long been a mystery to which Egan brings haunting, colorful new evidence. **Irish-America Heritage Month and Centenary of the 1916 Easter Rising** were featured in area parades, in a *Free Lance Star* article (Communities Section, March 6^{th}) and at four area libraries.

March 1-31: Irish American Heritage Month -- Our Heritage Committee began working on this project in November. Displays will be arranged at the Central Rappahannock Regional Library, the Salem Church Library and the Wilderness Library. At times/dates to be announced, knowledgeable Hibernians will be available at these locations to field questions and provide information.

March 17: **Division Mass** - Chaplain Father Fimian will celebrate Mass honoring St Patrick at 6:30PM in St Patrick Church. Eucharistic Adoration follows.

March 30: Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day. The Virginia Ancient Order of Hibernians initiated action to formally recognize past, current, and future contributions of Vietnam and Vietnam-era military veterans resident in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Former State Delegate Ed Scott championed this legislation. House Joint Resolution Number 136 designates March 30 as `Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day in Virginia to celebrate the service and numerous contributions of the Commonwealth's Vietnam-era veterans._ The resolution notes 1,304 Virginians lost their lives in Vietnam. Further, the resolution notes that more than 262,000 Vietnam veterans currently reside in the Commonwealth.

April 23: Commemoration of the Easter Rising 1916 at various locations around the world, but especially in New York City at the epicenter of American Hibernianism, St

May 17-June 5: The Kennedy Center presents IRELAND 100: Celebrating a Century of Irish Arts & Culture, a major festival highlighting Irish culture and its relationship to America.
