URGENT REQUEST

A bill in support of Malachy McAllister, the Belfast native who is subject to deportation on April 25, will be introduced in the House of Representatives on Monday (April 11) by Congressman Joe Crowley of New York.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians is mobilizing around the country, urging its members to reach out to House representatives to ask for relief for McAllister. He is to report for deportation on April 25 - an action which would bring an abrupt end his 20 years in the U.S. after fleeing the North of Ireland with his family after their home was attacked with gunfire of Loyalist paramilitaries in 1988. They first went to Canada and then to the U.S., where their quest for political asylum has been litigated ever since. McAllister, a former member of the Irish National Liberation Army, served three years in prison in the 1980s. Recently declassified U.K. intelligence documents indicate collusion between the British security forces and Loyalist paramilitaries in the attack on the McAllister home, making him even more worried about deportation.

Congressman Joe Crowley composed a letter to Jeh Johnson, Secretary, Homeland Security and Sarah Saldaña, Director, ICE. PLEASE call your representative TODAY; the number is (202) 225-3121. Give your zip code when requested and ask to speak to your Congressman's office. When connected ask to speak to the Legislation Officer or Immigration Liaison. Tell that person you support Congressman Joe Crowley's request that ICE exercise its discretion by taking quick action to suspend the deportation order against Mr. McAllister as he is no threat to this country. Ask your Congressman to contact Congressman Crowley and sign onto his letter! If not available, leave a message stating: "I would like to hear from the Congressman, the Chief of Staff or the Representative's Immigration person as soon as possible. Also ask for an email address in order to forward the Crowley letter:

`Dear Colleague,

Many of you have long joined efforts in support of change in Northern Ireland and its peoples. One such effort is to provide safe haven for Malachy McAllister who fled his native Belfast after he and his family were targets of an attempted assassination. After having been denied asylum and then having received deferred action from deportation for many years, Malachy is now facing deportation at the end of April. We are concerned for Malachy and his family, but are also concerned that his previous history is not being looked at through the lens of the greater context of Irish issues and the Troubles. The Good Friday Agreement and decades of U.S. efforts to achieve peace in Northern Ireland have depended on moving past a period of violence, and we are seriously concerned about any moves that signal steps backwards.

We will be sending the below letter to officials at the Department of Homeland Security and Department of State to clarify how Malachy's case is worthy of prosecutorial discretion and fits into the broader context of the Irish peace process. During the first week of April, I had a wonderful conversation with one of our division Brothers about Pope Francis' Extraordinary Year Jubilee of



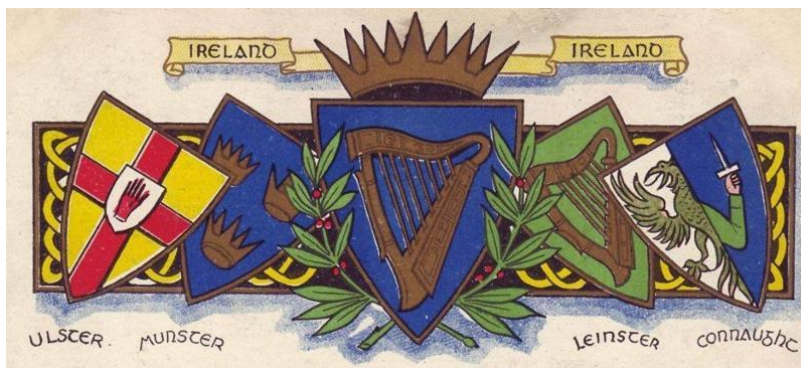

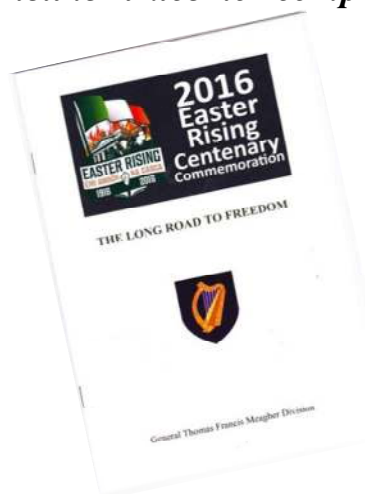

There can be no peace between the two people until either Ireland is a desert or is free. It is war to the knife, and the knife to the hilt. There can be neither truce nor compromise.”

This is a compilation of facts pertaining to the 800 years of the English occupation of Ireland. In it you'll read short biographies of the seven heroes of the Easter Rising executed in the weeks following the Rising. These executions set the stage for the Anglo-Irish War, establishment of the Irish Free State and the State of Northern Ireland, the Irish Civil War, and the 'Troubles' forward to Good Friday 1998.

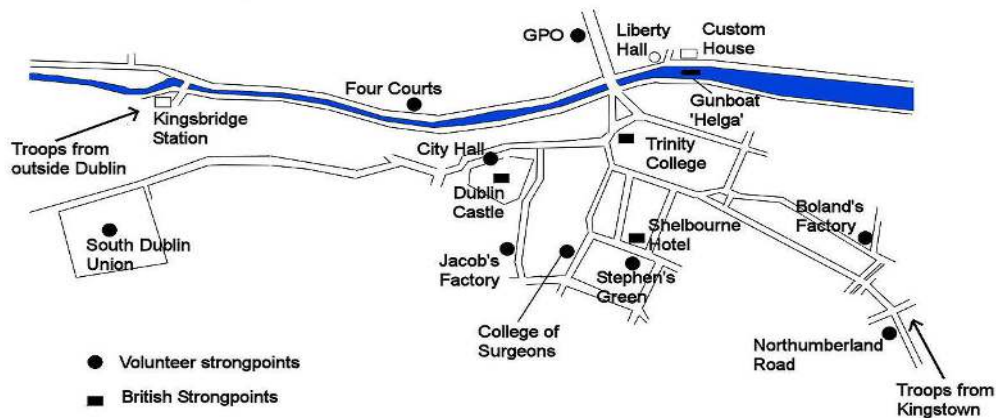

The Easter Rising -- Monday 24 April to Saturday 29 April

Organized by seven members of the Military Council of the Irish Republican Brotherhood (The Fenians), the Rising as planned for months was to commence on Easter Sunday. However, Eoin MacNeill, Chief of Staff of the Irish Volunteers, countermanded the order at the last minute. This caused confusion within the Irish Volunteers, the Irish Citizens Army and *Cumann na mBan*. Reluctant to give up on the rising, Joseph Plunkett and James Connolly modified their strategy and developed a hasty plan for Easter Monday. As a result only about 1,000 rebels appeared on Easter Monday to seize control of designated strategic sites in Dublin.

The principal Irish rebel positions at the General Post Office (GPO), the Four Courts, Jacob's Factory and Boland's Mill. James Connolly, overall military commander and four other members of the Military Council: Padraig Pearse, Tom Clarke, Seán Mac Dermott and Joseph Plunkett were in the GPO. After occupying the GPO, the Volunteers hoisted two Republican flags and Pearse read a Proclamation of the Republic. The rebel position at the South Dublin Union and Marrowbone Lane, further to the west, inflicted heavy losses on British troops. After days of shelling, the rebel headquarters garrison at the GPO was forced to abandon their position when fire caused by the shells spread to the GPO. Connolly had been incapacitated by a bullet wound and passed command to Pearse. Vastly outnumbered, Pearse agreed to an unconditional surrender.

HIBERNIANS AT AREA LIBRARIES

The essence of **Irish-American Heritage Month** and the **Centenary Anniversary of the Easter Rising** was shared with patrons at the Central Rappahannock Regional Library, the Salam Church Library, the England Run Library and the Wilderness Library (display only). Des Flanigan was chief negotiator with the library staffs, managed creation of beautiful posters provided by the library graphics department, and organized displays at each location. Des was assisted by Neil Buttimer, Peter Carroll, Harry Crisp, Bill Halpin, John Hogan, Paul O'Brien, and Hugh O'Brien. At Salem Church, we were fortunate to have the Muggivan School of Irish Dance demonstrate traditional Irish dance. During the nearly 40 hours spent at the area libraries, Hibernians shared their knowledge of Irish history, immigration, and the Easter Rising of 1916 with more than 200 visitors.

Easter Rising Centenary

the cause: english rule

Ireland was part of the United Kingdom in 1916. The country was ruled day-to-day by a British administration, based in Dublin. Although Ireland had elected representatives, the Irish didn't run the country, and their civil rights had been suppressed by the English for centuries.

the rising

On **Easter Monday, April 24, 1916**, a group of Irish nationalists proclaimed the establishment of the Irish Republic and, along with some 1,600 followers, staged a rebellion against the British government in Ireland. They envisaged a new Ireland as a national democracy; an Ireland which, in the words of their Proclamation, "guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and [which] declares its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation and all of its parts, cherishing all of the children of the nation equally." They believed that this could only be achieved through complete independence. The rebels seized prominent buildings in Dublin and clashed with British troops.

POBLACHT NA H EIREANN. THE PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC TO THE PEOPLE OF IRELAND.

IRISHMEN AND IRISHWOMEN: In the name of God and of the dead generations from which she receives her old tradition of nationhood, Ireland, through us, summons her children to her flag and strikes for her freedom.

Having organised and trained her manhood through her secret revolutionary organisation, the Irish Republican Brotherhood, and through her open military organisations, the Irish Volunteers and the Irish Citizen Army, having patiently perfected her discipline, having resolutely waited for the right moment to reveal itself, she now seizes that moment, and, supported by her exiled children in America and by gallant allies in Europe, but relying in the first on her own strength, she strikes in full confidence of victory.

We declare the right of the people of Ireland to the ownership of Ireland, and to the unfettered control of Irish destinies, to be sovereign and indefeasible. The long usurpation of that right by a foreign people and government has not extinguished the right, nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people. In every generation the Irish people have asserted their right to national freedom and sovereignty: six times during the past three hundred years they have asserted it in arms. Standing on that fundamental right and again asserting it in arms in the face of the world, we hereby proclaim the Irish Republic as a Sovereign Independent State, and we pledge our lives and the lives of our comrades-in-arms to the cause of its freedom, of its welfare, and of its exaltation among the nations.

The Irish Republic is entitled to, and hereby claims, the allegiance of every Irishman and Irishwoman. The Republic guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and declares its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation and of all its parts, cherishing all the children of the nation equally, and oblivious of the differences carefully fostered by an alien government, which have divided a minority from the majority in the past.

Until our arms have brought the opportune moment for the establishment of a permanent National Government, representative of the whole people of Ireland and elected by the suffrages of all her men and women, the Provisional Government, hereby constituted, will administer the civil and military affairs of the Republic in trust for the people.

We place the cause of the Irish Republic under the protection of the Most High God, Whose blessing we invoke upon our arms, and we pray that no one who serves that cause will dishonour it by cowardice, inhumanity, or rapine. In this supreme hour the Irish nation must, by its valour and discipline and by the readiness of its children to sacrifice themselves for the common good, prove itself worthy of the august destiny to which it is called.

March Is Irish-American Heritage Month

This year the Irish diaspora from Tokyo to Washington and from Dubai to Santiago will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the historic 1916 Easter Uprising. This is the event that started Ireland on the path to becoming an independent republic after nearly 800 years of occupation by a foreign power.

In the local area displays will focus on the anniversary, depict Ireland's long road to freedom and identify the men and women who bravely fought in the rebellion. Displays include information boards produced by the Central Rappahannock Regional Library Graphics Department, copies of the Poblacht Na H'Eireann (Republic of Ireland) proclamation, and associated 'factoids'. Information sheets about Irish/Irish-American contributions to the growth of our United States will be available for visitors. The displays show how the Irish are inextricably linked to the development of the United States in fields ranging from labor, politics and government, science and industry, local, state, and federal leadership, and entertainment.

The 2016 U.S. President's Irish-American Heritage Month Proclamation takes note that "generations of Irishmen and women have helped shape the idea of America, overcoming hardship and strife through strength and sacrifice, faith and family. With an undying belief that tomorrow always yields a brighter day, Irish Americans symbolize the perpetual optimism that defines our country, and they have long embodied the truth at the heart of our promise -- that no matter who you are or where you come from, in America, you can make it if you try. As we celebrate Irish-American Heritage Month, we recognize the Irish people's contributions to our country's dynamism -- sons and daughters of Erin have come to America's shores, adding to our rich vibrancy and putting their full hearts into everything they do. From building our country's cities as preeminent architects and earnest laborers to building our national character as people of great joy and cherished culture, Irish Americans have endured intolerance and discrimination to find a place for themselves and their children here in the United States."

Irish-Americans transformed America by placing power in the hands of local working men and women. They built immigrant aid societies that provided jobs and social services as models for future federal safety nets. At least 22 U.S. Presidents have Irish ancestral origins. The first men to walk on the moon, Neal Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin, were proud of their Irish heritage. More than 2000 Congressional Medals of Honor have been awarded to Irish-Americans. This is the extraordinary reality in the journey of Irish and Irish-Americans.

On March 7th and 14th Hibernians will be present and displays can be seen at the Salem Church Branch Library and later in the month at Central Rappahannock Regional Library (CRRL) and England Run Branch. Month-long displays can be seen at the CRRL and the Wilderness Library in Orange County. Check with your local library branch for the times and dates when Hibernians will be present at those locations.

Don't miss the **14th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade** on Saturday March 12th at noon in the Spotsylvania Business Park (Bowman Center off Rt 2). The parade is followed by an Irish music and dance festival at the Adventure Brewery (formerly the Blue & Gray) until 3PM. The Adventure Brewing Spotsylvania brewpub will be open too.
