### Notes from the 21st Virginia Biennial Convention



The convention keynote speaker was Dr. Ruan O'Donnell, Visiting Chair of Irish Studies, Notre Dame (2010-11) and currently Scholar in Residence at the University of Montana. He is the author of numerous books on the history of Irish republicanism. He gave an informative and energetic talk on the critical "Decade of Contention" following the Easter Rising and inspired deeper individual research into the personalities, activities and Irish-American influence during this important, yet least understood period in 20<sup>th</sup> century Irish history.

We were fortunate to have three National AOH officers attend the convention: National Treasurer Sean Pender, Regional National Director Denny Parks, and National Degrees and Ceremonies Chairman JJ Kelly.

The most prominent theme of this year's convention centered on commitment to the future of our Order. The "Why I am a Hibernian" campaign is part of a National AOH initiative to attract men who will carry the Order into the future. An unfortunate truth is to date nation-wide only 23 Hibernians saw fit to submit their thoughts on this. National AOH is reworking the website in a way that should help achieve this goal. At every jurisdiction Virginia AOH brothers must commit to recruiting new brothers and to retain current brothers. One suggestion is to publicize significant division activities in every local newspaper in Virginia. J.J. Kelly posited that brothers who commit to the Order's Major Degrees are more likely to remain active Hibernians.

Sean Pender noting that *Irish Central* "has the pulse of Irish America", reported that National AOH has an agreement with them to assist in the AOH recruitment initiative.

Freedom for All Ireland discussion: State Board FFAI co-chairs, Terry Riley and Jim McLaughlin appealed to conventioneers to establish a FFAI chairman in every division.

Immigration discussion: Sean Pender pointed out that the U.S. immigration quota for Irish citizens in 200/year. This number is not sufficient and certainly does not consider the tremendous contributions to this county made by Irish men and women over the past 250 years.

Under new business, the State Board for 2017-2019 was elected. They are: President Bill Halpin, Vice President Jay McCarthy, Secretary Brian Kiernan, and Treasurer Bob Fay. National Treasurer Sean Pender, assisted by National Director Denny Parks, installed the new officers after Mass on Saturday afternoon. (BTW: Bill is the fourth General Meagher Division brother to be so elected. Others from TFM were Jack A'hearn, Hugh O'Brien and Bruce Denault.)



"The Celt would forfeit his title to the respect of the civilized world, did he not fight with all his heart and all his soul and all his cunning against the empire which has despoiled him and murdered his kin, now with arms, now with artificial famine. There can be no peace between the two people until either Ireland is a desert or is free. It is war to the knife, and the knife to the hilt. There can be neither truce nor compromise."

The green flag



The Green Flag was the *unofficial* Irish national flag used by Wolf Tone and the United Irishmen in 1798 and until the early 20th century. A gold harp on a blue field was the Arms of Ireland

beginning in the 16th century, but the United Irishmen changed the color of the field to green - a color that symbolized revolution in the late 18th century.

Irish Nationalists carried leaves, branches and 'liberty' trees as republican emblems at the time. This ditty explains:

What have you got in your hand? Where did it bud?

A green bough In France

Where did it first grow? Where are you going to plant it? In America In the crown of Great Britain

The Green Flag was carried during the rebellion of 1798 - often with the motto of the United Irishmen, 'Éire go brách' ('Ireland forever'), below the harp.



That year, the poet Mícheál Óg Ó Longáin, a United Irishman, wrote:

Go bhfeiceam Éire saor gan daoirse Is an bhratainn uaine in uachtar scaoilte, Gach tíoránach claoincheardach coimhtheach In ainm an diabhail is gan Dia dá gcoimhdeacht.

May I see Ireland free and without oppression And the green flag flying on high, With every treacherous foreign tyrant In hell and with no protection from God.

The Green Flag quickly won popular acceptance as the national flag of Ireland. It was used by the followers of Daniel O'Connell, by the Fenians, and by supporters of Home Rule from the time of Parnell until the collapse of the Irish Parliamentary Party in 1918. It lost popular support because it was used by the British army as a recruitment tool during World War I.

In 1945 the Irish government returned to the golden harp on a field of blue as the National Arms of Ireland.

In a perfect world every brother would have these articles of clothing:

- For **semi-formal/formal occasions**, the AOH "uniform" is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH State and National conventions, Masses, funerals, AOH dinners, parades, and other public events.
- At **informal events** (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

**Green Jacket**: Brothers procure their own green jackets. Tell them you're with AOH and the \$5.00 small order fee can be waived. Kelly green is the color.

**AOH Sash**: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waist line).
