#### Vice President Dave McLaughlin

## Did you know?

- Almost half of Washington's Troops in the American Revolution were Irish by birth or decent, among them 1,500 Officers, including 26 Generals
- ➤ Irish born William Thompson was the first Colonel commissioned in the U.S. Army. In 1775, he was appointed Colonel in the Continental Army and helped defend Boston. He was promoted to brigadier-general and he is buried in the Old Carlisle (PA) Cemetery.
- ➤ The Irish flag stands inside the Alamo in recognition of the largest ethnic group to give their lives defending that icon of independence 12 native-born Irishmen
- ➤ Charles Thompson of County Derry designed the Great Seal of the United States

#### The Hedge Schools of Ireland

Teaching, an ancient and honorable profession, was once a dangerous calling in Ireland. For two centuries the English denied Irish access to both justice and education. The early 18th century parents who were illiterate through no fault of their own, and men who had somehow learned teaching skills despite the law, took matters into their own hands. Determination was their answer to frustration, and the Irish hedge schools were born.

The British government described hedge schools as guerilla warfare against the laws that prohibited education of the Irish. Anyone who sheltered or housed a schoolteacher was penalized if the secret was discovered. The family's house was burned, its crops destroyed. The Irish, however, have always been resourceful. To avoid risking family homes and property, the hedge-school teacher took his students out-of-doors. He would select a remote corner, the hidden side of a hedge or a mossy bank out of view by passing strangers and class was underway. A different student was selected each day to serve as a lookout and would give the signal if a stranger approached. The few books and pieces of paper were quickly hidden and teacher and students scattered until the danger passed.

It is significant that in the 16th and 17th centuries about 20 colleges for Irish Catholic students were established on the European continent. Salamanca, Lisbon, Douai, Antwerp, Toulouse, Paris and Prague each boasted an Irish university. In Rome, there were at least four. From these schools the brightest or the most ambitious hedge school "graduates" found their way into the army, the Church, Foreign Service, and the legal and medical professions.

This speaks to the academic standards of the Elementary reading, open-air schools. writing and mathematics were the first lessons, later followed by Latin, Greek, higher mathematics, history, geography, bookkeeping, surveying and navigation. The itinerant hedge-school teachers are credited with preserving the Irish language and much of the poetry and legends of Ireland. Some of these dedicated teachers copied complete books by hand and then loaned them to their students. No social gathering was complete without the hedge school teacher. He was the unpaid village scribe and the parish clerk.

### The Manchester Martyrs -- 150 Years Ago

November 23d marked the 150th anniversary of the execution of the brave Fenian heroes, known as "The Manchester Martyrs."

On 18 September 1867 Colonel Rickard Burke, Captain Michael O'Brien, Captain Edward Condon and a party of 15 Bold Fenian Men rescued IRB Chief Executive Colonel Thomas Kelly, and IRB commander for Manchester and Liverpool, Captain Timothy Deasy, as they were being transported from Bellevue gaol (jail) by British Authorities. (Fenian Officers Burke, Condon, O'Brien, Kelly and Deasy were members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians in America.)

During the rescue, Police Sergeant Charles Brett was accidently shot a killed. A number of the rescuers and dozens of innocent local Irishmen were arrested and brought to trial for Brett's murder. On 28 October, William Allen, Michael Larkin, Captain O'Brien, and Captain Condon were convicted and sentenced to death by hanging.

As was custom at the time, after sentencing, prisoners made statements to the court.

Condon in his speech spoke these immortal words,

"You will soon send us before God and I am perfectly prepared to go. I have nothing to regret, or retract, or take back. I can only say GOD SAVE IRELAND".

His companions rose and extending their hand-cuffed hands upward cried out "GOD SAVE IRELAND!"

On 23 November, Allen, Larkin and O'Brien were publicly hanged. They were buried in unmarked graves of quicklime in unconsecrated ground within New Bailey Prison. Condon was also convicted, but as an American citizen his death sentence was commuted to 20 years penal servitude; he served 15 years.

Reporter T.D. Sullivan who witnessed the trial and execution was inspired to write "*God Save Ireland*" which became the virtual Irish national anthem.

- At **informal events** (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirt (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

**Green Jacket**: Brothers procure their own green jackets. **AOH Sash**: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waist line).
