February 2013 Highlights Completing 25 years of Friendship, Unity and Christian Charity in the greater Fredericksburg area!

The Division met as scheduled on February 19th with 30 brothers in attendance. Vice President Bill Phillips presided as President Halpin was excused (needed to (among other things) play at Trump International, Puerto Rico). The Division now boasts 46 members including four newly sworn brothers, Rusty O'Brien, Sean Fogerty, Patrick Fogerty, and Dennis Ryan, plus Mike Yearsley who transferred from New Jersey.

Increasing by five new brothers is a terrific way to start the New Year! This bodes well for the division that initiated 17 new brothers in 2012. With some effort we'll be at 60 brothers this time next year.

We'll be recruiting in March ⁻ hopefully at all parishes. We're set for St Jude on 16-17 March and *tentatively* set for the same weekend at St Patrick. I haven't from our St Mary and St Matthew LNOs (realizing Patrick Fogerty just signed-on as liaison to St Mary).

At risk of being redundant, I say again we're very happy all of you decided to join the AOH and become integral to the division's future. We see great potential in you and look forward to your assumption of leadership positions in the coming years. None of the Division officer positions are life-long incumbencies. My hope is that in October, you will accept nomination for a Division officer position.

Committee Reports:

a. *Help and Hope for Meaningful Employment Program*: Program chairman, Chuck Payne, updated on Help & Hope for Meaningful Employment 1. When the volunteers met on January 11, we saw a need to broaden the program announcement beyond the weekly parish bulletins. We did the following.

* Announcements were made from the altar at each parish with representative outside church after Mass to discuss program with people who are interested.

* Handouts about the program are available at Mary's Shelter, St, Vincent DePaul, and St. Matthew ministries.

* Interview televised on the local Comcast channel (2?) outlined the Help & Hope program.

2. Need help from Division members.

* Volunteers. As the number of participants grows (currently about 20), our volunteers will be stretched and we will be limited for one-on-one help. We could use some more volunteers.

* Network. Chuck would like to use Division members as a network. We could do this both for occupations and for companies. For example, if we have a participant who is an electrical engineer, we could send a broadcast to Division members asking for anyone who is an electrical engineer to talk with this individual (a) to give advice and (b) to point the individual to someone else who may have further advice. Also, if one of our participants is considering a job at XYZ Company, we can send a broadcast to see if anyone works, or worked, at XYZ or knows someone who works at XYZ who would be willing to talk to the individual about XYZ -- its culture, the hiring manager, anything else that would be helpful.

3. Help & Hope business cards that have Chuck's H&H contact info on one side and the program session schedule on the flip side are available. Division members can take one or several of the cards so they can refer folks who need this help.

b. *Trip for Two to Ireland Raffle:* Standing Committee Chair Jim O Donnell distributed 21 raffled tickets to each brother (he mailed 21 tickets to the brothers who could not attend the February meeting). He reiterated raffle objectives at the meeting and in a letter to absentees. The minimum goal (21 tickets) is very `doable_ for every brother. A few brothers already volunteered to sell ticket at the Irish Festival following the St Patrick Day Parade on March 16; however, we `ll need more!

c. *Halfway to St Patrick Day Celebration*: Brother Jim McMorrow is chairing the Halfway Party committee. A committee of elected division officers was established and voted of the various options. The date is now set for October 12, 2013 at the Hospitality House in Fredericksburg. Our experience there in December was very positive ⁻ service was great and the food was excellent! We'll be printing 250 tickets for our second annual celebration priced at \$50/person. Music will be provided by *Moch Pryderi* and the Muggivan Irish Dance School will perform and provide *céilí* dance lessons. Both entertained at our celebration last September and did a great job!
