NEWS FROM THE VAAOH STATE MEETING 2 NOVEMBER IN RICHMOND - YOUR IMMEDIATE ATTENTION REQUESTED

Mr. Kevin Conmy, Deputy Chief of Mission, Embassy of Ireland, spoke on the topic of Irish Immigration. The Irish embassy is engaged in this issue and commented on the centuries-long connection between Ireland and the United States. Prior to 1965, Irish immigration was without restrictions. In 1965, the U.S. Immigration and Nationality Act made immigration more difficult. As a result more than 50,000 Irish nationals reside illegally in the U.S.

The U.S. Senate proposes a legal pathway to citizenship, providing 10,500 E-3 visas specifically for Ireland. These visas are valid for two years and can be renewed three times, after which a green card can be issued [Note: an E-3 visa is for persons seeking employment in a specialty occupation requiring at least a bachelor's degree or equivalent]. House Republicans are not enthusiastic about the Senate's comprehensive proposal. They prefer a piecemeal approach. Mr. Conmy requested AOH convince Virginia representatives that 'we want reform now._ He identified Eric Cantor and Bob Goodlatte as key members to lobby.

Brothers, Our National Immigration Chairman, Dan Dennehy, is urging all of us to stand with the U.S. Catholic Bishops in their effort to promote House passage of Comprehensive Immigration Reform. ALSO: The following resolution was presented and will be voted on at the State meeting scheduled for January 25, 2014. The resolution was introduced by Brother Bobby Mahoney who was recently appointed VAAOH State Immigration Chairman.

A.O.H. Virginia State Board,

Whereas the Preamble in our AOH National Constitution, Item 7, states that a main purpose of our organization is to encourage an equitable U.S. immigration law for Ireland and to cooperate with groups for a fair American Immigration Policy,

Whereas noting with satisfaction the current efforts of the National Immigration Chairman, Dan Dennehy, working to secure a legal path for Ireland s undocumented and secure future flow for Irish immigrants

Whereas the fact that Comprehensive Immigration Reform is now possible and Irish people will have a real opportunity from current legislation to create a new life for themselves in our great Nation and to continue to contribute to the important bonds between Ireland and the US,

1. Encourage all Virginia AOH Divisions to cooperate with other organizations at the grassroots level to support the cause of equitable immigration reform;

2. Urge members to comply with the goals of U.S. Catholic Bishops and their goals to pass a just and compassionate immigration reform;

3. Call on appointed Immigration Chairmen and our Brother and Sister Hibernians and their families to help in attaining the successful passing of this reform;

4. Request each Division of the Virginia AOH appoint a Chairman of Immigration whose duties it will be to work with the Immigration Chair appointed by the National and State Boards."

### **Quinnipiac: Great Hunger Museum**

The absence of cameras in 1845 and the lack of shocking artifacts as are found in Holocaust museums could have hindered Quinnipiac University's chances of creating a successful Irish famine museum. However, a successful exhibit is what was accomplished `In the galleries of Ireland's Great Hunger Museum we come face to face with what really happened.\_

`This has the surprising effect of simultaneously softening and sharpening the gruesome facts,\_

The art isn't difficult to merely look at like a picture from a concentration camp but it's also difficult to process. Looking deeper into the art allows one to truly feel the emotion like tension in a small room.\_

Lilian Lucy Davidson's 'Burying the child\_ is described as 'the central figure leaning into his shovel almost as he were still digging potatoes; but it is a straightforward picture of loss.\_ Davidson captures the anger, sorrow and reality of the famine with a simple painting.

The Great Hunger Museum houses artwork that directly blames the British Government. Michael Farrell's 'Black :47\_ -- 'a courtroom in which five Irish skeletons emerge from a coffin to accuse Britain, in the reviled person of Charles E. Trevelyan, who ran the government's disastrously inadequate efforts.\_

The museum is able to depict the reality of the famine and debate that surrounds it. Great Hunger Museum is located at 3011 Whitney Avenue, Hamden Connecticut. <u>www.ighm.org</u>.

(Editor's Note: Google the artists and painting for better appreciation. Keep in mind that the potato crop failure played a role in the famine. However, during the famine period 1846-51, Ireland s food production was controlled by the British and Ireland was a net exporter of grains and meat  $\overline{}$  foodstuffs that could have saved a million lives. By any definition, this was a calculated genocide. We should not forget that it is by the grace of God that <u>our</u> forefathers survived and we're here.)

**Viet Nam Memorial in Ennis, Ireland**: Rory Breslin, (<u>www.rorybreslin.com</u>) was selected to sculpt the memorial. He is a major artist and has had significant commissions including a bust of Teddy Kennedy. The estimated cost of the memorial is B145K.
