

Call to Action


Last Friday, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a new COVID relief bill, called the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which addresses the needs of many vulnerable people related to the pandemic. Unfortunately, unlike previous COVID relief bills, this bill appropriates billions of taxpayer dollars that are not subject to longstanding, bi-partisan pro-life protections that are needed to prevent this funding from paying for abortions. The Senate is expected to vote this week.

TAKE ACTION NOW

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to express its support for additional COVID-19 relief that prioritizes the poor and vulnerable and its strong opposition to any taxpayer dollars going to abortion as part of this legislation, saying that the Hyde Amendment policy must be included before this bill moves forward.

One activity that helps Birthchoice is a baby shower, where an organization collects baby items to donate, and Birthchoice uses the donations to help a mom choosing life for her baby. "Each Birthchoice client leaves with a gift bag helping them celebrate the new life they carry within."

Since collecting items during the pandemic would be difficult, the division suggested to Birthchoice creating an online baby registry (e.g. Walmart, Amazon) where Brothers could select needed items and the items ship directly to Birthchoice. Division President Bob Martin commented, "Our Brothers embraced this new way to help Mom's celebrate choosing life"





First Letter of John

As we read the following passage from the First Letter of John 1:6-10, where St. John speaks about God as Light, take a few moments to examine your conscience and consider where God's Light needs to shine in us and today's world.

"If we say, "We have fellowship with him," while we continue to walk in darkness,



we lie and do not act in truth. But if we walk in the light as he is in the light, then we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of his Son Jesus cleanses us from all sin. If we say, "We are without sin," we deceive ourselves,* and the truth is not in us. If we acknowledge our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from every wrongdoing. If we say, "We have not sinned," we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."



Catechism of the Catholic Church Church teachings on human life Catechism Paragraph 2270

Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person - among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life.

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you."

"My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately wrought in the depths of the earth."

Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law:

"You shall not kill the embryo by abortion and shall not cause the newborn to perish."

"God, the Lord of life, has entrusted to men the noble mission of safeguarding life, and men must carry it out in a manner worthy of themselves. Life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception: abortion and infanticide are abominable crimes."

St. Patrick's Feast Day - March, 17th, 2021

St. Patrick was a man of profound faith. His extraordinary evangelical efforts reached more people that the original 12 Apostles combined. Patrick's ministry spread from Ireland into Great Britain and through Western Europe. The Great Diaspora spread Catholics, and their faith, from Ireland across the globe, most notably, the United States, where, up through the 20th century, more that 55% of Catholic Priests were either from Ireland, or of Irish Decent.

Paragraph from "The Confessions of St. Patrick," paragraph 13, that ties in with our reading from St. John above. "So be amazed, all you people great and small who fear God! You well-educated people in authority, listen and examine this carefully. Who was it who called one as foolish as I am from the middle of those who are seen to be wise and experienced in law and powerful in speech and in everything? If I am most looked down upon, yet he inspired me, before others, so that I would faithfully serve the nations with awe and reverence and without blame: the nations to whom the love of Christ brought me. His gift was that I would spend my life, if I were worthy of it, to serving them in truth and with humility to the end."
