Brothers Bill Halpin, Dave McLaughlin, Jeff Everett, and I participated as voting delegates at the AOH National Convention in Pittsburgh, PA, on 14-16 July. With 1002 delegate slots available, there were 408 voting delegates present and Virginia was the only state in which all of our voting delegate slots were filled - 30 delegates for 30 slots! The complete minutes of the convention will be shared with us soon, but of particular note was the vote on the proposed Constitutional amendment to remove the requirement for all members to be male. After several minutes of lively discussion, this proposal was overwhelmingly voted down.

Even with the heat and humidity of the Virginia summer, the work of the Division continues. Thanks to the efforts of the parish liaisons, successful raffle ticket sales events have already been held at St. Jude, St. Matthew, and St. Mary Churches. There are two ticket sales weekends scheduled at St. Patrick Church at all Masses on 06-07 Aug and 10-11 Sep. If you attend Mass at St. Patrick Church, please stop by before or after to help man the table. We have noticed that if brothers of the parish help at the tables, the parishioners see the familiar face, stop to say hello, and they are more likely to buy raffle tickets.

Trip For Two to Ireland raffles ticket sales in high gear.



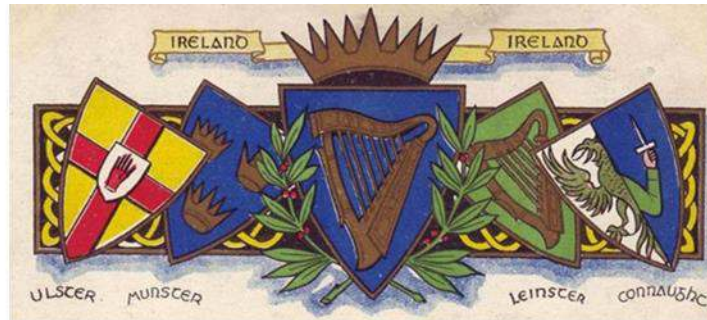
Shawn Lenahan is managing sales again this year. We kicked off sales this year on 25-26 June at St. Jude Parish where Shawn, Dennis O’Keefe and Jack Kelly sold 160 tickets. This was followed by the sales at Lake of the Woods on 2 July and then another banner weekend at St. Matthew Parish. Parish liaison Frank Connors, Jack Kelly and John McGrogan assisted Shawn and they sold another 108 tickets. At St. Mary sales were limited to one Mass (*why?*) where 52 tickets were sold.

Did You Know?



In Ireland, the last Sunday in July is called Reek Sunday (aka: Garland Sunday), the day when pilgrims climb Ireland's holiest mountain, Croagh Patrick. Located five miles outside the County Mayo town of Westport, Croagh Patrick is a conically-shaped mountain that commands the surrounding countryside. It's 2,500 feet high, and the path at a 60° incline is rough, littered with loose rocks to navigate with every step.

Tradition has it Saint Patrick completed a 40-day Lenten fast in 441AD at the peak. A statue of the Saint marks the start of the steep climb. Amazingly, many pilgrims make the climb in bare feet. At the summit there is a chapel where a priest celebrates Mass for the thousands of pilgrims who climb the mountain on that special day.



David Trimble 1945-2022

David Trimble, 77 died on Monday, July 25. Trimble and John Hume, former Social Democratic and Labor Party (SDLP) leader, were awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1998 for negotiating and enacting the Good Friday Agreement marking the end of an era known as “The Troubles”.

Sinn Féin leader Mary Lou McDonald wrote: “His contribution to building the peace process in Ireland will stand as a proud and living legacy of his political life. Condolences to his wife Daphne and family. Ar dheis De go raibh a anam,” she wrote.



Special Envoy to the north of Ireland

Northern Ireland First Minister and Sinn Féin Vice President Michelle O’Neill met with U.S. Senators and State Department officials on Capitol Hill last week. O’Neill urged the Biden administration to appoint a Special Envoy to Northern Ireland. “It is particularly important as we move into the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday agreement. In the past we have benefited from special envoy, and I would like to see that in place again”. She met with Senators Chuck Schumer, Chris Murphy, and others.

Irish Protocol

On 12 June, U.S. SecState Blinken spoke with UK Foreign Secretary Elizabeth Truss. Truss is a leading candidate to replace Boris Johnson. Blinken urged Truss to continue good faith negotiations with the EU to preserve the Good Friday Agreement.

Note: Truss sponsored the legislation designed to nullify the Irish Protocol and she is determined to see it pass into law. Although many experts believe this legislation is a breach of international law, the bill cleared the House of Commons. Last week the European Commission launched legal action against Britain.

Semi-formal/formal occasions: The AOH “uniform” is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH Masses, funerals, dinners, parades, State and National conventions, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
