MARCH IS IRISH AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH IN VIRGINIA!

This year the Irish diaspora will commemorate the 35^h anniversary of the historic Good Friday Agreements. These agreements signed in 1998 ended the "Troubles" that plagued the north of Ireland for thirty years and cost an estimated 3600 lives.

Hibernians from the General Thomas F. Meagher Division will be present at three area libraries during the afternoon hours as follows: Salem Church Branch March 7, 8, 9; Howell Branch (English Run area) March 14, 15, 16; and the Central Rappahannock Regional Library March 21, 22, 23.

The display will review 30 years of the "Troubles", explain the Good Friday Agreements, discuss the United Kingdom's treaty obligations resulting from BREXIT, the Irish Protocol. It will highlight the roles of President Clinton, George Mitchel, Irish politicians John Hume and David Trimble who brokered the agreements and received the 1998 Nobel Peace Prize.

The Division has donated more than \$100,000 to local charities and for scholastic awards. Funding derives from community support for the annual *Trip for Two to Ireland*

NI Update:

On Monday (27 Feb) British Prime Minister Sunak and European Commission President Von der Leyen announced what may be a "decisive breakthrough" regarding the Northern Ireland Protocol. It remains to be seen if this will end the protocol stalemate. The UK parliament must vote to approve it and according to the UK PM Sunak, that vote will be held "at the appropriate time". Also ... will the DUP approve? Some DUP leaders have already commented that this breakthrough does not go far enough.

Soon we'll learn if the DUP Stormont boycott is really over the NI Protocol or a just a reaction to the Sinn Féin victory in May 2022 and Michelle O'Neill's position as first minister.

(*Déjà vu?* This feels like Irish Home Rule promises in 1893, 1896, and 1912. The English parliament couldn't muster the votes to pass due to NI/loyalist opposition.)

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets -- Kelly green is the color.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
