## News from the Quarterly State Convention

The AOH state quarterly meeting was hosted by the Father Kelley Division in Manassas on 27 January.

1. The 130 “Hibernian Bears” are due to arrive in time for Easter (31 March) – a suitable time to sell them. Each division will be asked to buy 20 bears at \$15.00 each and resell them for \$20.00 to \$25.00 each.
2. Every division must have an Organizer. If nobody volunteers for the job, it can be assigned as an additional duty to the Standing Committee Chairman or Vice President,
3. FFAI donations are below expectations. Divisions are asked to “dig Deep” for organizational and/or individual donations. Donations must be prior to 1 Feb.
4. To be considered for 2023 State Hibernian of the Year nominations must be received NLT 15 March
5. The VA State directory was updated on 26 Jan. It is on the VA State website.
6. VA AOH total membership is 757 brothers.
7. Brian Tumulty (Fr. Kelley Div) volunteered to be the State Immigration Chairman.

There is increased interest in Ireland and Irish history.

“*Belfast: The Story of a City and Its People*” by Feargal Cochrane a Belfast native, a Catholic who grew up in Protestant neighborhood during the 1960s. Cochrane tells the story of Belfast city and why the people there are the way they are. I read it, highlighted in in the October newsletter, and recommend it.

“*Becoming Irish American – The Making and Remaking of a People from Roanoke*” to JFK” by Timothy J. Meagher. I am currently reading this one and

continuously finding new and interesting information on how Irish immigrants assimilated into a predominantly Protestant country.

“Making Empire” by Jane Ohlmeyer traces the ugly history of England’s domination in Ireland “underscoring the brutalities.” Recently highlighted in the Wall Stret Journal, it is on my “to buy” list.

Perhaps More interesting are some innovative Irish American whiskeys – a balance of traditions.

The WJS’ weekend edition (20-21 Jan) highlighted five “American whiskeys with an Irish soul”, combinations of Irish whiskies and American bourbon and rye.

1. Keeper’s Heart Irish+Bourbon Cask Strength – 2/3 bourbon, 1/3 Irish is bottled at 118 proof. “Best with a splash of water.” (\$50)
2. Hercules Mulligan Eyr & Rye – combination of two Irish whiskeys and three American ryes with cherry juice. “Slightly fruity” (\$50)
3. Restless Spirits Stone Breaker – blend of four-year-old Irish whiskey and American malt whiskey (\$44)
4. BrotherShip Irish American Whiskey – 55% 10-year-old Irish from Connacht and 45% 10-year-old American whiskey. “hints of salt and smoke” (\$52)
5. Four Walls Irish American Whiskey – a blend of malts and grain Irish with American rye. “perfect for hot toddies or chase with a beer.” (\$32)

Republic of Ireland challenges England in European Court

On 19 January 2024, the European Court of Human Rights acknowledged the Republic of Ireland's petition contesting the English *Legacy and Reconciliation Act of 2023*. The English bill passed into laws in September 2023 grants immunity to British military and/or civilians for deaths and injuries they could be criminally liable for between 1 January 1966 and 10 April 1998 in the north of Ireland. Total amnesty for crimes, including murder, committed during the period! The Irish case cites Articles 2 (right to life); 3 (prohibition of torture and inhuman or degrading treatment); 6 (right to a fair trial); 13 (right to an effective remedy); and 14 (prohibition of discrimination) as the basis for its case.

Every brother should have these articles of clothing.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets -- Kelly green is the color.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
