

#### **USS Patrick Gallagher**

In March 2022, on the 55th anniversary of Patrick Gallagher's death in Viet Nam, the keel for the USS Patrick Gallagher, designated DDG 127, was laid at the Bath Ironworks shipyard. The Naval Sea Systems Command confirmed the ship will enter water for the first time this summer. The USS Patrick Gallagher will join her sister ships the USS John Barry and the USS Michael Murphy.

Born in County Mayo in 1944, Patrick immigrated in 1962. Subject to the draft, he decided to enlist in the Marine Corps and was deployed to Viet Nam. On July 18, 1966, Patrick's team was engaged by the Viet Cong. During the firefight Gallagher and three other Marines were in a

foxhole when a Viet Cong hand grenades landed on the rim. Gallagher kicked the grenade away where it exploded. A second grenade landed among the four Marines. Gallagher jumped onto the grenade to protect his friends. When the grenade didn't immediately detonate, Gallagher threw it toward the advancing enemy where it exploded. His Navy Cross citation states: "Without hesitation, in a valiant act of self-sacrifice, Lance Corporal Gallagher threw himself upon the deadly grenade in order to absorb the explosion and save the lives of his comrades". As submitted, the award was for the Medal of Honor. It was downgraded "because he wasn't killed by the grenade". An effort continues to achieve award the MOH. On 30 March 1967 Patrick was on a routine patrol near Da Nang when his unit was ambushed. Patrick was killed in action.

## **Update: Legacy and Reconciliation Act of 2023**

The English are planning to produce an "official" history of the Troubles. Of course, "official" means it will be officially written and officially approved by the English. It'll be a "history" that probably will further disparage the Irish nationalist movement in the north of Ireland. Reminds me of a quote from Winston Churchill's speech to House of Commons on 23 Jan 1948: "History will be kind to me because I intend to write it."

The English will for a Prime minister on July 4<sup>th</sup>. The Labor Party candidate Keir Starmer said he'll repeal the Legacy Act. If elected there'll be no amnesties for paramilitaries or soldiers. Inquests must be held as well as investigations, prosecutions, and civil action. Meanwhile the Conservative Tories who have mistreated the Irish for decades, plans to introduce mandatory

national service for 18-year-olds including those in the north of Ireland. Think about that! Young people from a nationalist background will be forced to join the British army! (BTW the term Tory was derived from the Middle Irish word *tóraidhe*, which means outlaw or robber.)

The European Court on Human Rights judicial review of the Act remains pending as it has since the Republic of Ireland's petition contesting the Act was received on 19 Jan 2024. If the ECHR moves any slower it will become moot with a Labour Party win.

# Why is it that No Irish saint has been canonized for over 700 years?

That question was answered in July 1690 at the Battle of the Boyne. That's when the Protestant Ascendency began its rise. The Penal laws in 1695 and appeared to be a vendetta against the Irish people. The bigotry and brutality that followed presaged the Gestapo. Catholics were forbidden to speak or read Irish Gaelic, vote, own land, study medicine and law, join the army, own a horse or weapon. Even listening to Irish music was a crime. But even worse was the prohibition on the freedom to practice the Catholic faith. Priests could be hunted with hounds as if they were foxes. If priest-hunters discovered a secret Mass, the parishioners were often killed along with the priest.

Today there are 28 Irish natives on the Blessed roster, only one step away from canonization.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets -- Kelly green is the color.

**AOH Sash:** Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
